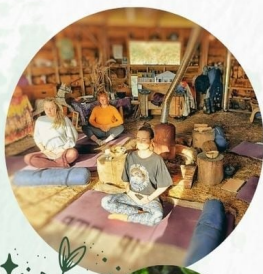

WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

Bitesize report of Parish Council Meeting 4th of April 2024

Present: 9 Parish Councillors, Cllr Julian Kirk, Parish Clerk and 12 member of the public.

1) Welcome from the Chairman and Public Participation –

a. Issues with the increased HGV traffic on King John Bank with concerns on the weight on the ditches etc. The traffic Management Plan that was part of the planning application is not being adhered to and there is no signage in place at all. The enforcement office at Borough are not helpful and I am hoping the Parish Council can help. The lorries start at 6.30 instead of 8.00am and this has been going on since last November. AB advised that he had attended the recent meeting, and the contractors seem to be very open to comments. The member of the public advised that there have been 5 different contractors on site, so it was difficult to get any concerns raised. Just need the signage. JK advised that this was on-going with enforcement/planning.

b. Pylon meeting on the 25th of March – unfortunately this date clashed with our NDP meeting. A further meeting is being held tomorrow at 2pm at West Walton Village Hall with Liz Truss attending, who is against pylons.

2) Matters arising:

NDP – Paul Blandford advised that the meeting held on the 25th of March was well attended and there are now 6 members on the steering committee. CCP summarised the current position and there was nothing to be gained from another call for land. The Draft Plan is now available on the website and the next meeting will be on the 30th of April. from 7pm – home venue due to costs of hiring the community centre. He requested that the parish councillors read the draft plan before the 30th and make any comments. This is very important.

Cllr Lawty stated that a separate meeting was needed to discuss what is not in the plan and handed out details on this matter. As the parish councillors had not had time to review these details, it can be added to the comments for the draft plan.

Verdant Energy and ib Vogt presentation – Cllrs Bliss attended, and Cllr Brooks had a lot of questions which they took away for comments. It was very communitive, and they were encouraging groups to contact them for funding. Approximately 40 people attended. Trampoline quote to be considered.

3) To receive reports:

Highway – Cllr James advised that the hedge has been cut back on corner of Police Road but has not improved visibility and residents asked if a mirror could be installed.

Cllr Eveleigh raised the question of the horses on Police Road re change of use from agricultural to equestrian

2 pot holes reported on West Drove Road had been filled in within 2 weeks.

County and Borough Councillor's Reports:

Cllr Kirk reported that there should be grants available for the D-Day 80 celebrations and asked if anything was being arranged at the Walpoles. Enforcement have advised that the ditch on Walnut Road, where the flooding is occurring, was filled in before the houses were built. The situation will not improve until the ditch is cleared. Our end of West Drove has residents complaining about the pylons and he will be at the meeting tomorrow.

Clerk Report: Small allotments – Plot 2 is still vacant but 2 interested residents have come forward. The CIL funding information for the play area has been completed, returned to BCKLWN and confirmation of payment within the next 7 days has been received. Increase in calls regarding complaints re the HGV's on King Johns Bank from residents – road surface damage, ditches, speeding etc.

Now working on year-end reports followed by the AGAR.

Cllr Blunt had called asking for Cllr Bliss to contact him regarding the planning committee meeting next Monday and also that he has requested a statement from planning regarding Folgate Lane planning applications

Village Crier, Social Media, and Website reports:

Crier –one delivery route vacant, and Cllr Campion offered to help. 2 new advertisers and no lost ones. Pick up points were suggested but difficult for some people to collect. It was suggested to reduce the editions to 4 a year but this may affect advertisers. Cllr Kirk offered to help deliver and to let him know along with another member of the public. Both were thanked.

Bitesize Report of the Parish Council Meeting 2nd of May 2024

Present: 10 Parish Councillors, Cllr Julian Kirk, Parish Clerk and 6 members of the public.

- 1) **Election of Chairman** – Cllr Boston proposed Cllr Bliss, seconded Cllr Eveleigh and all in favour except Cllr Lawty who abstained.
- 2) **Election of Vice Chairman** – Cllr James proposed by Cllr Bliss, seconded Cllr Luck and all in favour except Cllr Lawty who abstained.
- 3) **Welcome** from the Chairman and Public Participation – None
- 4) **Matters arising:**

NDP – Paul Blandford advised that a Steering Group meeting was held on the 30th of April and thanked Andy and Tracey for the use of their home. Cllr Smith was present. Comments and feedback were covered from Cllrs Bliss and Lawty. Decisions based on poor feedback in the past. The next step is to move forward and draft plan which CCP will undertake, hopefully for the 1st week in June, it is then submitted to the Borough Council which will take approximately 6 weeks and then the Community consultation follows for another 6 weeks. Once approved, it will go to regulation 14.

Verdant Energy – nothing to add but they were not very forthcoming when asked for funding of a trampoline at the Play Area.

National Grid proposals – meeting to be held on the 20th of May at the Community Centre.

Voltwise Power update - Cllr James will look into this on our behalf. Cllr Lawty commented that we are in a position to dictate, and Cllr Brooks advised that more requests for land are likely to be forthcoming.

5) To receive reports:

Highway s–Potholes on Police Road, near Stickfast Lane and on West Drove North.

The state of Chalk Road has been reported to Highways but no action as yet.

More vehicles were parking on Church Road and the verges are close to collapsing in the dyke. Increase in speeding noted on Wisbech – Springfield Roads.

Clerk Report: Small allotments – New plot 12 is vacant but have an interested parishioner.

Finance has taken up much of April with Internal Auditor requirements and AGAR completion plus CIL return.

Play Area -The clerk gave out information on the funded cycle storage to JL and DL proposed an 8 bike unit, seconded by AB and all in favour. JL advised that the temporary fencing has been removed was thanked for all her hard work.

Village Crier, Social Media, and Website reports:

Crier –all advertisers had now paid. The Facebook page cannot be used and to be removed from the agenda. The website continues to evolve with 361 viewings Fly-tipping on Gooses Lane with 3 bin bags and it was suggested to look into a litter pick.

SAM reports – AE will provide report at a later date.

Communications/Correspondence:

Insurance Renewal – clerk advised this has increased from £846.20 to £944.62 fixed 3 year deal and this includes increase in play area equipment.

Approved/

Residents on Bustards Lane complained about the speeding and danger to horses and walkers. Clerk and Cllr Kirk have been in contact with Highways who did not think signage would work but would consider road markings and Cllr Kirk happy to put funding towards this.

6) **Planning** – to consider Planning Applications - None

7) **Finance**—payments/receipts, bank reconciliation and statements for April approved. Bank balance at the end of April was £40978.07 including £11,492.70 Solar Fund money.

Payments (to date) for May approved.

AGAR report, section 1 & 2 – approved and signed.

Review the internal auditors report – approved

Explanation of Variances report – approved

Items for next agenda – NDP, Solar Farm Fund.

Message from your Borough Councillors

After a sunny weekend and although my back is aching after too much gardening on Saturday, it's time to update you on what happening *at the King's Lynn and West Norfolk Borough Council.*



GYPSY AND TRAVELLER POTENTIAL SITES AND POLICY CONSULTATION

A council consultation opened on 10 May to seek people's views on the proposed sites and policies to meet the need of gypsies, travellers and travelling showpeople. Earlier consultations aimed to gather as many options for sites as possible and consider the suitability of potential sites and policies to meet the needs of gypsies, travellers and travelling showpeople in the borough.

Now people are being asked for their views on proposed sites and policies, to help inform the Borough Council's Local Plan.

As part of the ongoing examination of the Local Plan, the council was asked by planning inspectors to produce an updated Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Assessment (GTAA), which it did in June last year.

This assessment identified that the accommodation needs for gypsies and travellers across the borough had risen more than tenfold from the previous assessment in 2016.

To finalise the process, the council is now seeking to undertake a further consultation on those sites it proposes should be allocated to meet the five-year accommodation needs as required by current national planning policy.

The consultation closes on 21 June, when all responses and relevant documentation will be sent to the inspectors for their consideration. The inspectors will then issue a set of Matters, Issues and Questions on this topic (late August) which will form part of the scheduled hearing session for gypsy and traveller provision in September.

Enforcement powers - About the enforcement powers that our officers hold

Local authority Environmental Health Teams have responsibility for taking whatever enforcement action may be necessary, in the public interest, across a range of areas, such as:

- community safety and neighbourhood nuisance (for example, a noisy neighbour or fly-tipping)
- environmental quality (for example non compliance with an environmental permit).
- housing standards (for example, poor living conditions and unlicensed HMO's)
- food, health and safety (for example, poor food hygiene and unsafe working practices)
- licensing (for example, closure of an unlicensed premises)

If we need to visit you during the course of carrying out our duties, you have the right to check the enforcement powers we hold.

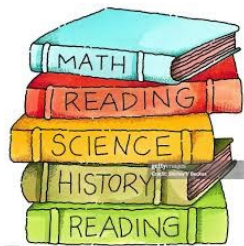
We are also busy preparing for our new Reception intake this term and are holding an open evening as well as some separate sessions preparing our new Year R children for September.

Walpole St Peter Parish Hall Demolition and Rebuild

After over five years of fundraising originally started by Les Street who left the village some time ago, we are finally ready to begin the rebuild of Walpole St Peter Parish Hall.

It has been a long, hard path but perseverance has paid off and by the time this article is published, we will be on our way to a new hall. It seems fitting that we will be rebuilding in the 100th year after the building was originally gifted to the parish in 1924.

We have researched and applied for so many grants and received donations from so many schemes and individuals. We created the TROPHY (To Rebuild Our Parish Hall Yes) group of volunteers, who have worked so hard over the years organising bingos, afternoon teas, archive mornings, dog shows, fish and chip suppers, craft fairs etc. etc. we cannot thank everyone enough. The journey has certainly had its ups and downs!

Since closing the parish hall, we have cleared the contents and sold everything which was no longer required - including the stage and the flooring!

Still lots more work to do, and decisions to be made, but at the end of it all we will have a lovely new hall so we can continue to make memories. We will post our progress on Walpole St Peter Parish Hall Facebook page and of course in the Crier, and we can't wait to welcome everyone back to our wonderful new hall!

Les Street having left the village, continued to donate to the rebuild until he sadly passed away only a few weeks ago. Les so wanted to stay around to see the start of the project he began but sadly it was not to be.

Thanks to everyone who helped to make the dream of a new parish hall become a reality when it could so easily have ended life as just a memory of what we once had.

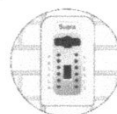

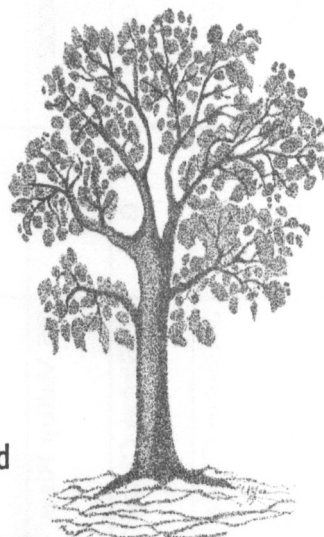

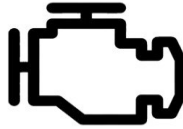

This Special Council Meeting was to debate Gypsy Travellers and Travelling Show People Proposed Sites and Policy Consultation. This consultation affects some parishes within my ward and division. I spoke during the debate, pointing out it is very unfair the Parishes who already have a high percentage of traveller sites are expected to take more and expand those already in place. A number of sites have had their enforcement notices lifted. There seems to be one law for travellers and one for homeowners and businesses who are expected to obey strict planning rules. On April 5th I welcomed Liz Truss MP to a meeting in West Walton Village Hall to discuss the proposed New Grimsby to Walpole Power Line and Substation, Liz spent over an hour talking to residents and listening to their concerns. Liz is hoping to arrange a meeting with the energy minister to discuss these plans.

I have started to allocate funds from my Local Members Fund (LMF) for infrastructure projects throughout my county division. This includes SAM2 machines for Walpole Highway and Walpole Cross Keys and the reinstatement of bollards on the verges of St Mary's Road, West Walton

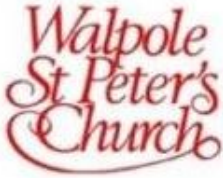

From the Church Window – June/July 2024

A few years ago I visited Pensthorpe Nature Reserve, near Fakenham, and was fortunate to see something that is very rare – turtle doves. The rarity of these beautiful birds (they are on the conservation red list), and the opportunity of seeing them and hearing the purring call that heralds summer, is something to cherish.

Turtle doves are mentioned in the Bible. When Mary and Joseph presented Jesus as a baby at the Temple they offered two turtle doves, the offering of the poor, in obedience to Jewish law. Doves in general play a significant part in the Bible: Noah sent out a dove from the ark and it brought back an olive branch, signifying that it had found dry land and the flood was receding.

At the baptism of Jesus, the Spirit of God descended on him from heaven in the form of a dove. But best of all is the Song of Solomon, which is often read at weddings: 'For behold, the winter is past; the rain is over and gone. The flowers appear on the earth, the time of singing has come, and the voice of the turtle dove is heard in our land.'

Symbolic of faithful love and gentleness, the turtle dove features in literature and poetry. When 'the turtle trewe' in Geoffrey Chaucer's *The Parliament of Fowles* addresses the birds that have assembled on St Valentine's Day to choose a mate, she speaks to them of lifelong commitment in love. Representative of peace, gentleness, faithful commitment, and lifelong love, and calling to mind the Holy Spirit, this is a special bird that graces and blesses Pensthorpe in summer with its presence and song. Do go and see them if you can.

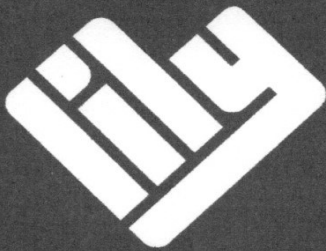
