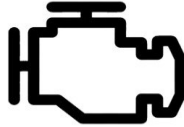

WALPOLE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Bitesize Draft version of meeting held - 7th of November 2024

Present: 9 Parish Councillors, County Councillor Julian Kirk, Parish Clerk and 4 members of the public.

Welcome from the Chairman.

Public Participation –

Update given on the rebuilding of the Parish Hall. The foundations are now complete, and the work is progressing well.

Matters arising:

NDP – Mr. Blandford raised concern that there was a lack of understanding of the NCP within the community and some residents, including councillors, were finding the Reg 14 report hard work.

RB advised that training will be required on the planning aspects of the plan to ensure the parish council are aware of the policies that would affect any applications.

The team were thanked for delivering the flyers.

The open event on the 21st of November at the Garden Room has 2 sessions from e 10-12 noon and 5-7pm.

The Walpole Parish Council holds approximately £11,000.00 in the solar farm fund. These funds are community funds and so we would welcome applications from any groups or individuals who are involved in any local community events, charities or parish projects.

We are offering awards of up to £500.00. Please email the Parish Clerk, Caroline Boyden, on parishclerk@walpole-pc.gov.uk for an application form or <https://www.walpole-pc.gov.uk/documents> and select Grant Award Application form.

Verdant Energy and National Grid – Cllr Blunt advised that the new BCKLWN CEO, Kate Blakemore and Borough Leader Alistair Beales were given a tour of the ward including the solar farms/substation which horrified Kate. Cllr Kirk was also present.

A stakeholder group of “influencers” including Jim Moriarty, Richard Blunt and Julian Kirk is to be set up. 1 parish councillor for each parish and a member of the public will also be included. Working on the Terms of Reference for this group.

The additional “booster stations” along the proposed inland line were questioned and why is an additional substation being built?

Concerns raised that the Walpoles are being dumped on as we have no infrastructure to support growth with no doctors, dentists, local shops etc. The risks regarding battery storage are still unknown. The HGV's are still not using the approved routes or sticking to the allocated times.

It is realised that we cannot stop the Grimsby to Walpole line but why not go under the sea and Wash or even take the line to Bacton which is already set up.

To receive reports:

Highways – Speeding on Walnut Road and when will West Drove North be completed? RB will ask the King's Lynn Drainage Board for an update.

County and Borough Councillor's Reports:

Cllr Kirk had reported the overhanging hedges on Walnut Road, but highways were not interested. The road signs on Bustards Lane have still not been put up.

Attended meetings at County Hall today regarding prisoners and how they get access to doctors and dentists on tap.

Clerk Report: The cycle storage unit grant has been completed and awaiting payment from Borough. CIL income received of £4.7k. Continuing working with Mr. Blandford on the Reg 14. Grass cutting tender approved and will send out to interested parties. Working on the budget for 25/26.

Government is reviewing the use of online meetings.

Village Crier, Facebook and Website reports:

Crier – 1 new advertiser has come on board and the editor will only send out 1 reminder to non-invoice payers. The editor was thanked for all her hard work.

Clerk advised 326 views in October of the website.

Footpaths and circular walks – It was reported that the footpath from Follens Road to Eastlands Bank was very overgrown and cannot be reported online anymore.

Community Fund Projects Working Group – Christmas tree is looking good.

Play area – JL has found the second sign and post which needs installing and the other sign is wobbly. The zip wire is causing concern again and it appears that the rollers have flattened. Quote for over £800 from Online Playground appears very expensive and concerns raised that the ongoing costs of maintaining the zip wire do not warrant the expense. Clerk to obtain contact details of other maintenance providers.

The gate is still sticking. There is an issue with the location of the new adult outdoor equipment as regulations regarding the distance between it and the playground mean it would not work.

Walpole St Peter Parish Hall Update

All good news! We are finally moving forward with our rebuild after a few months of soil testing and its consequences! As many of you will know if you have ever been involved in any building project, there are many things which unexpectedly come to light and take time (and money) to sort out. With us it was the soil tests once the old hall was demolished. All this work took time to complete, and for the foundation plans to be updated to take account of the additional peat which was discovered. This work has now concluded, and thanks to our builders, Dawson Building Construction Ltd, we have moved forward at a good pace despite some very wet weather in the early stages! Thanks must also go to Peter Humphrey Associates (Architects) for their continued assistance in all aspects of the works.

At the time of writing this update, the foundations for the new hall have been completed and the main framework is in progress. I am sure by the time this article is published (weather permitting) we will be even further forward!

The contracted completion date for the new hall is mid May, so we are getting excited about welcoming all our regular, and of course new hirers back to the Parish Hall.

Message from your Borough Councillors



I attended the Walpole St Peter Remembrance Service. I am honoured to lay a wreath on behalf of the residents of the Walpoles. Julian laid a wreath at West Walton. It was very well attended.



The names of the people from Walpole St Peter and St Andrew who had died in the first and second world wars and in Northern Ireland were read out. Several wreaths were laid on the steps of the War Memorial. The young were very well represented by The Squirrels, Beavers, Cubs and Scouts.

On Wednesday the 30th of October, Julian and I gave the Borough Council's new Chief Executive, Kate Blakemore and Borough Council's Leader, Alistair Beales, on a tour of our Ward.

It was a 30-mile round trip, starting in Walpole St Peter, Walpole St Andrew followed Walpole Highway, West Walton Highway, Parts of Walsoken, West Walton returning via Walpole Marsh to Walpole St Peter. The ward is the 7th largest in the Borough with an electorate of over 6000.

We highlighted several issues to them. Initially the new housing growth in all the ward caused by new house allocations in the current local Plan, five year land supply applications and infill development. Although most villages have good school provision, there is a lack of shops and other facilities in the villages. Sadly, we were unable to illustrate the traffic issues along School Road West Walton as it was half term, and the road was almost clear of traffic. We illustrated several other issues in the ward, illegal caravan parking, illegal development in Folgate Lane, plus our general concern relating planning enforcement conditions such as ignoring the traffic plans for the Walpole substation development and illegal parking outside schools. We were able discuss our concerns re the proposed Grimsby to Walpole pylon route and the lack of information and consultation. It hoped the borough will form Ward wide stakeholders' group to raise some of the many concerns about these developments which are forced upon us without consideration for the residents of our ward.

We finished the tour back in St Peters, where they met the Chairmen of our Parish Councils.

I am delighted to see good progress is being made on the rebuilding of the village hall.

December 2024 newsletter / report

Dear Constituents,

I hope you are all well. Compiling this report on the 31st of October to meet Magazine print deadlines.

To recap on what I have been up too during October, I have attended all meetings I was scheduled to.

The theme for this month is Mud, as many of you will know I earn my living from agriculture, 99% of those working in Agriculture respect the surrounding communities and infrastructure. In recent years the Government has thrown money into the net zero agenda, one of the spin offs of this is companies being set up to grow crops to be processed through a digester to produce methane gas to power engines connected to generators to produce electricity, in my humble opinion this is not green energy. Crops grown around our area are hauled off the Mepal in Cambridgeshire for digestion.

One of the companies, Pretoria Energy have little or no respect for our area, their land management skills are zero, they apply slurry from the digestors when the soil is far too wet, they trash our roads, leaving mud and slurry all over the roads and verges, if they do scrape the roads, they push the mud into ditches blocking drains. I have repeatedly messaged the company to advise them of the situation. I have used my own telehandler and bucket and hand shovel to try and keep the highway clear in the past. Today the 31st of October I have emailed the Environment Agency, the Police and Highways, something must be done, local business are having their access blocked by slurry tankers and equipment, the tarmac road surface is being damaged.

On the 30th of October Cllr Richard Blunt and I took the new CEO and the council leader of the BCKLWN for a tour of our Borough ward, a ninety-minute road trip, both were taken aback by the share geographical size of the ward. We then held a meeting with Parish Council Chairs from the ward, all agreed the exercise was well worth the time, enabling the CEO to talk to the local chairperson and see for herself the issues we have.

I continue to do what I can with my Brush Cutter on Blind Corners, around Litter and Dog Poo Bins and Bus Stops.

I have attended Parish Council Meetings within my Borough Ward and County Division.

My offer of help to collect shopping and or prescriptions for constituents who are housebound continues please contact me if you require help.

I have received phone calls and emails from constituents with concerns on many subjects, these have been dealt with in a timely manner and the outcome shared with the constituent concerned.

CHOCOLATE & BRANDY SHOTS



The quickest chocolate mousse you will ever make – no raw eggs or gelatine. It's very rich but that's perfect for a small serving after a meal. Serve in small espresso cups or shot glasses, you will need 8-12 depending on size.

Ingredients

200g/7 oz dark chocolate (approx. 52% cocoa solids)
2 tbsp brandy
150ml/1/4 pint pouring double cream
250g/9oz full-fat mascarpone cheese, at room temperature.

Method

1. Remove 2 squares of chocolate and finely grate them. Set aside for the garnish.
2. Break the remaining chocolate into a pan, pour in the brandy and cream, and heat gently until the chocolate is melted and well incorporated. Set aside to cool slightly.
3. Spoon the mascarpone into a large bowl. Stir well so it is a smooth paste, then gradually add the melted chocolate mixture and mix until smooth.
4. Pour into your shot glasses or espresso cups. Sprinkle the grated chocolate on top and chill in the fridge for at least 2 hours. Serve chilled.

This recipe can be made up to 2 days ahead. Not suitable for freezing.
