Welcome from the Vice Chairman

Public Participation - None

Matters Arising:

National Grid update - it was agreed that Cllr Blunt invite James Wild MP to a public meeting at Walpole.

To receive reports:

Councillors Reports: Cllr Eveleigh advised that the new 20mph sign at the school was now in place.

Cllr Eveleigh was thanked for his work with the contractors using the incorrect route, mainly Newells. After speaking to the site foreman, all drivers should now be issued with the correct routes.

County and Borough Councillors Reports:

Cllr Blunt - Cllr Blunt advised that the Borough Council report for the Devolution is delayed, and the report is awaited.

The CIL funding process is to be changed with a more strategic approach rather than community. Cllr Blunt has heard that the elections next year maybe cancelled.

Cllr Kirk - Advised that nothing had been heard regarding the cancelling of elections next year. The elections for the new mayor will be taking place next year and rumours that they will be based in Ipswich. Cllr Kirk has the community grant of £5k to support local events etc., and requests over £500 have to be crowd fund matched. Members fund is available.

Clerk Report: August has been a very busy month. All our policies/procedures have been checked and updated to ensure we are compliant and are on the website.

The AGAR had been approved by the external auditor.

I have attended training on the forthcoming Assertion 10 which will bring additional work and all councillors must have .gov.uk emails.

Village Crier: The Crier is now in profit which is great news.

Play area - Cllr Luck advised that the areas are in good condition and the new signage is awaited.

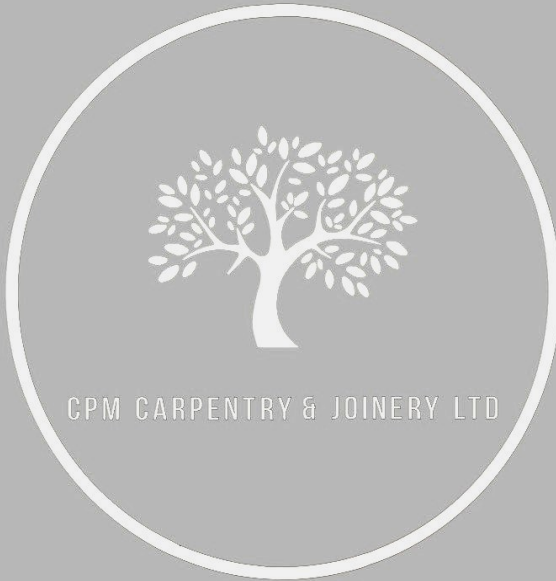

**Message from your
Borough Councillor
Richard Blunt**



After our summer break, the nights are starting to draw in, the children back at school, it's time to write my update to you on what been happening at the Borough Council over the last few months.

I have dedicated this update of the Proposal for the future of Local Government which has recently been published. Working together as the Future Norfolk (www.futurenorfolk.com) six district councils including West Norfolk have published a shared, strong proposal for the future of Local Government in the county, informed by what matters most to our communities.

Our final submission for three unitary councils ensures clear local accountability and more responsive services tailored to local areas, while remaining large enough to operate efficiently across all services. The report will now be discussed by Full Council's at all six authorities.

The following statement was released by the Leader of the Borough Council Alistair Beales.

"I am very pleased to tell you that the six Norfolk districts working together on Local Government Reorganisation have just published our proposed final submission, setting out our robust business case for three unitary councils. You can read about the proposal on our Future Norfolk website. This milestone represents a huge amount of detailed development work involving Council Leaders, CEOs and project teams at all six authorities, together with extensive community engagement over the summer.

Our shared vision

The Government wants to see the creation of new unitary authorities in Norfolk and Suffolk from 2028. Whilst we didn't ask for this reorganisation, and many believe the status quo works very well, reorganisation should be seen as a once-in-a-generation opportunity to deliver positive reform, renewal and innovation in how we best serve our communities into the future and to create the best path to inclusive growth and prosperity for local residents and businesses. As you know, our shared vision is for three unitaries serving three distinct geographies and communities across the 2,074 square miles of our large and diverse county: a predominantly rural authority here in the West, a predominantly rural and coastal authority in the East, and a city authority centred on a greater Norwich.

Our final submission sets out a clear, strong business case for why three unitary councils (as opposed to just one or two) will best serve the people of Norfolk, putting local people,

Three unitaries will mean local decisions can be made by local leaders and representatives who understand their communities, services can be shaped by and tailored to the strengths and needs of each area, while councils are large enough to work efficiently in delivering people’s priorities across all council services, making the most of opportunities for Norfolk to thrive.

Indeed, from our recent “Future Norfolk” public survey, completed by nearly 5,000 people, including more than 1,300 across West Norfolk and Breckland, we know these are very important considerations for our people – local accountability, service responsiveness and efficiency. The proposed new West authority brings together, geographically speaking, the areas currently served by the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk, Breckland District Council and a small part of South Norfolk. A new Town Council for King’s Lynn will address the current democratic deficit and provide direct, place-based representation.

It is important to recognise that reorganisation is not a merger of districts and county, nor a takeover of any authority by another, it is the creation of a brand-new single-tier authorities, responsible for both district and county council services. Financial resilience is a key focus of our proposal, and the detailed financial projections and plan show the long-term viability of all three councils. The new West Norfolk unitary is projected to enter reorganisation with a structural surplus, providing a strong foundation for future sustainability and service delivery.

Next steps

As you know, our proposal is made jointly by six district councils, Breckland, Broadland, Great Yarmouth, North Norfolk, Norwich and ourselves. That means that no fewer than 269 district and city councillors will have the opportunity to scrutinise, debate and vote on our proposal before we submit to Government on 26 September. The Government will then launch a public consultation in November on all proposals it has received.

The report will then make its way through the following meetings:

- Joint Panel – 15th September
- Cabinet – 16th September
- Full Council – 18th September

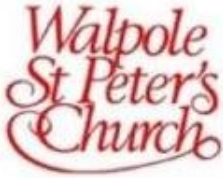

At long last we have finished the rebuild of Walpole Parish Hall and we finally opened our doors on July 5th. It's been a long time coming but looks like it will be even more popular than we hoped.

A little bit of our history.....

The parish hall began life as a barn, given to the village by the Rev Staveley who was the then rector of Walpole St Peter, and who owned Dovecote Farm which included the lovely house opposite the church.

The barn was originally given to the parish in 1924 for a Gentleman's Club to be set up, however after renovation it soon became the hub of the village hosting tombolas (bingos), dances, British Legion parties for the children, wedding receptions and much, much more.

The dances, featuring local bands were very popular, not only with the local community, but also with the air crews at Sutton Bridge during the Second World War. These dances it seems, were responsible for many a village romance!

As you are all aware, this old hall did a fantastic job for 100 years but eventually the decision had to be taken to rebuild it or lose it. So, along with Mr Les Street, who is sadly no longer with us, and with the community's agreement, the Committee set about raising enough money to demolish and rebuild - £385,000.

A massive thank you to all grant givers, those who donated their experience and time, the TROPHY fundraising ladies and everyone who attended our events and have helped to make the project a reality.

All that said, we are now open for business! We have been so pleased to welcome our regulars back to the new hall, and it's been great to see new hires - Art classes, Yoga, the Wild Hub, business meetings, parties, christenings etc.

Hopefully the sunshine will continue for a good while yet and our children will continue enjoying the autumn sunshine at lunchtimes and after school.

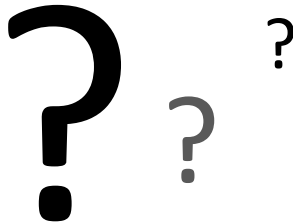
